

MEMBERSHIP

Membership Is currently being revised and is available to:

- Community Corrections Officers,
- Probation Officers,
- Parole Officers or Probation and Parole Officers who are substantially involved in supervision, counselling and/or management of offenders in a community correctional setting and/or parole work in an institutional setting

HONARY MEMBERSHIP IS OPEN TO:

- Persons other than serving Probation Officers, Parole Officers, Probation and Parole Officers and Community Corrections Officers; discretion for such membership is invested in the Executive.
- Persons undergoing full-time in-service training within the fields of community-based offender management who until their appointment is confirmed:
- Volunteers in the field of community-based offender management. Persons designated by the Executive as having made a significant contribution to the Association or to the community-based management of offenders in which case the Executive may appoint them as Honorary Life Members.

Associate Membership Members may elect, on leaving work in the field of community based offender management to become associate members without paying another fee for the current financial year. Affiliate Membership In those Australian jurisdictions which have their own professional association representing probation and parole / community corrections officers which is recognized by PACCOA, membership of such an association automatically brings with it membership of PACCOA.

Honorary Corporate Membership Organizations with an interest in the field of probation and parole / community corrections which may apply for admission as honorary corporate associate members and discretion to admit them lies with the Executive. Ex Officio Corporate Membership of the Association is available to Government Departments and Corporations which employ Probation and Parole / Community Corrections Officers. Corporate membership may be accorded, to private companies employing probation and parole / community corrections officers and discretion lies with the Executive as to whether they are to be recognized for the purpose of Ex-officio Corporate Membership.
